Indiana University South Bend Theatre - Dance <u>Entrance Auditions</u>

Entrance auditions allow students to go directly into the major, BFA in theatre with a concentration in dance, based on the recommendations of the faculty. <u>Students will also be eligible for scholarships</u> <u>specifically set aside for new students, which will be based on the interview/audition process.</u> Students who do not audition, or those that do not pass directly into the major (via successful entrance audition) are encouraged to attend IUSB as a pre-theatre major and will have the opportunity to officially enter the major at the end of their first year, based on performance, and must pass into the major by the end of their second year as a pre-theatre student or will be asked to choose another scholastic path.

The Theatre BFA with a concentration in Dance at IUSB accepts auditions in the following ways: <u>Digital</u> <u>Submission</u> and <u>In-Person</u>

1) <u>Digital Submission*</u>

What to prepare for a Digital Submission:

Overall

Each piece should be filmed/uploaded as a separate piece of media. No continuous videos

Slate

There should not be a separate "slate" video, rather slates are to appear at the beginning of each piece.

The proper slate for a dance piece is to share your name, the title of the piece, and the choreographer.

Dance Pieces (2)

Dance Piece #1

- One dance piece of original choreography demonstrating the student's specialty. This can be choreographed by the student or by a dance teacher/other choreographer.
- This piece is to be 60- 90 seconds in length.

Dance Piece # 2

- One dance piece of pre-choreographed material, sent to the student by IUSB. This choreography will be a mix of many technical styles.
- This piece will be sent to the student to learn once we are notified of interest in auditioning for the program.

What to prepare for an In-Person Audition*:

Upon entering the room feel free to say hello as you hand us your resume and headshot, then cross to the mark at center and start with your slate when told we are ready.

Slate

Please slate in the following way:

- 1) Say hello and introduce yourself by telling us your name.
- 2) Slate your choreographed dance piece by saying:

" I will be performing a dance from **title of piece** by **choreographer's name**. Thank you."

Perform your dance piece.

3) Following this you may be asked a few questions by the faculty. This is also a good time for you to ask any questions you have.

4) You will then be taught a second dance routine choreographed by faculty. This will either happen immediately following your audition or in conjunction with other dance and/or musical theatre auditionees.

Dance Audition Requirements

Dance Pieces (2)

Dance Piece #1 (pre-prepared by student)

- One dance piece of original choreography demonstrating the student's specialty. This can be choreographed by the student or by a dance teacher/other choreographer.
- This piece is to be 60- 90 seconds in length.

Dance Piece # 2 (choreographed by faculty member and taught on-site)

Overview of an in-person audition day:

1) You will meet with the faculty present and taken on a tour of our Theatre and Dance facilities. During this, you will be given time to ask any informal questions you may have and get to know the faculty a bit.

2) You will then have about 15 minutes to prepare and center yourself before you are called into the room one by one for your individual audition.

3) You will then have a short interview with the faculty in which you can ask any questions you have and the faculty can as well.

4) As a Theatre-Dance auditionee you will then be brought into the room for a group dance call with anyone else auditioning that day that needs to dance.

4) Following the audition, you will be excused for the day and should hear from us within two weeks or less.
